



Amazing Historical Significance Pocatello...




Established in 1889, Pocatello, also referred to as the "Gate City" or the "Gateway to the Northwest" has a rich and wonderful history and served an integral part in the settlement of the American West. Pocatello is located at the mouth of the Portneuf River Canyon as it opens up into the broad Snake River Plain. Pocatello is located at the intersection of U.S. HWY 86 and U.S. HWY I-15 with access to Pocatello Regional Airport and Union Pacific Railroad. Pocatello has always welcomed visitors, tourists, new residents and new businesses and continues to

receive recognition from national publications for the city's business-friendly approach to starting and operating a business. Pocatello is a diverse community with a strong community bond, known as the "smile capitol" and self proclaimed "volunteer capitol".

Pocatello has always served a pivotal role access to the northwest as European and American trappers/ explorers began coming into the region circa 1810. In 1825 to 1826 Peter Skeen Ogden led a beaver trapping expedition along the Snake River and its tributaries. In 1843 Captain John C. Fremont led a military surveying expedition that mapped much of the West. His party stopped at Fort Hall, just north of what is now Pocatello. As pioneers, gold miners, and settlers traveled the Oregon Trail, they passed through the Portneuf Gap south of town and used Fremont's maps extensively in their travel. Passing through Pocatello, early overland travelers broke off the Oregon Trail near Fort Hall on their way to California.

Business is presently thriving in Pocatello! With over \$1 Billion invested and over 800 new jobs created in 2011, the future looks bright. Pocatello today offers access to cutting-edge telecommunications services and is home to many high technology companies which continue to expand. From the early days of the Oregon Short Line to today's Union Pacific, the railroad has had a large presence in Pocatello and continues to be among its top 10 employers. Pocatello also continues its tradition as a hard working blue collar community in industry and manufacturing.




